Frequently Asked Questions & Eligible Services

1. *Is your organization requesting funding to purchase equipment?*

2. *What is an Evidence Based Intervention (EBI)?*

It is a conscientious, problem-solving approach that incorporates the best evidence from well-designed studies, patient values and patient preferences to provide quality interventions and services.

3. *What type of EBIs are required for WBCI Community Grants?*

A Community Grantee must select one or more of these three EBIs:

- a. Reducing Barriers,
- b. Providing Patient Navigation Services to Encourage Breast Cancer Screening, Diagnosis and/or Treatment and/or
- c. Support to Patients/Survivors.

4. *Can we select more than one EBI?*

Yes. Grantee applicants are encouraged to select as many EBIs and services as they will be providing. WBCI reviewers will be considering not only the quality of the services provided, but also the number of individuals served and the amount of services provided during the grant period.

5. *Once an EBI is selected, can we select how we will provide it?*

Yes, but you will be selecting from the services that research has proven to have the best outcomes. The next page provides a more detailed description of services for each of the EBIs.

6. *How do I determine quantifiable service goals?*

When you select your EBI and the service you will provide, you will be asked to provide a goal on the number of services you provide. Goals will vary depending upon the services, but you should carefully consider how much funding you are requesting and what you will be able to provide with those funds.

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Selecting Evidence Based Interventions & The Services To Provide Them

- 1. If you will be Reducing Barriers, you may select from one or more of these services to provide.**
 - a. Hosting an outreach event that is held either during the weekend or after 5pm during the week. Events must include free breast cancer screenings, mammograms, vouchers for mammograms and/or scheduling for mammograms.
 - b. Early detection screenings that are completed in a non-clinical setting and/or during the week after 5pm.
 - c. Breast cancer education, prevention or supportive services to non-English speakers

- 2. If you will be providing Patient Navigation Services to Encourage Breast Cancer Screening, Diagnosis and/or Treatment, you may select from one or more of these services to provide.**
 - a. Vouchers for lodging when there is required travel
 - b. Gas cards for transportation
 - c. Scheduling assistance
 - i. Scheduling assistance that resulted in a non-WBCI funded clinical exam, screening mammogram, diagnostic mammogram and/or ultrasound diagnostic test.
 - ii. Scheduling assistance that resulted in a WBCI funded early detection clinical exam, screening mammogram, diagnostic mammogram and/or ultrasound diagnostic test.

- 3. If you will be providing Support to Patients/Survivors, you may select from one or more of these services to provide:**
 - a. Group support sessions
 - b. One-on-one individual counseling sessions
 - c. Breast boutique services
